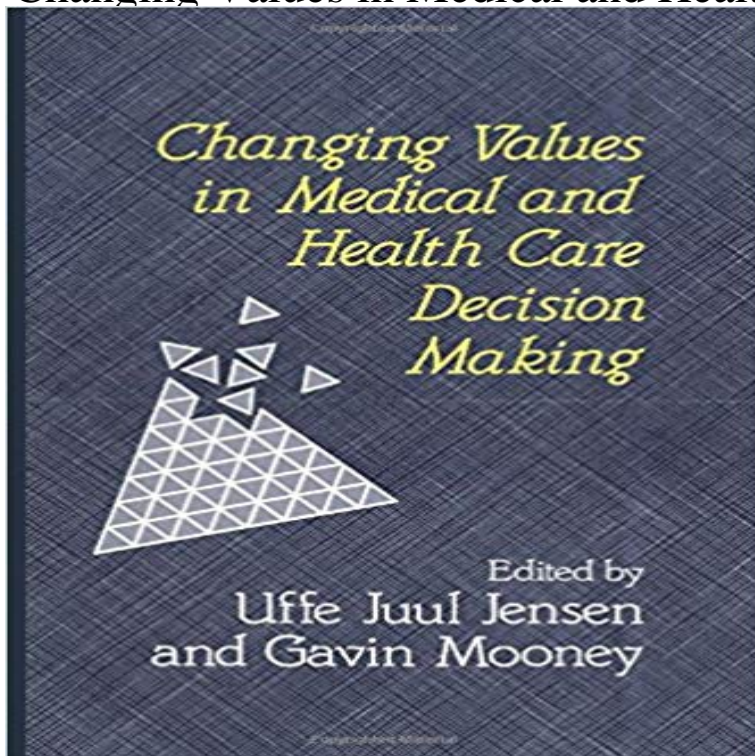


Changing Values in Medical and Healthcare Decision-Making
